



Petite Sirah 2014

Baileys of Glenrowan is a pioneer of winemaking in North-East Victoria, producing its first vintage in 1870. Since this time Baileys has become renowned for consistently producing intensely flavoured, long-lived red wines and world class fortifieds.

Petite Sirah is an alternate name for the Durif grape, most commonly used throughout North America. We believe the name Petite Sirah better suits the style of wine we are aiming for with this release; aromatic, spicy and textured, with a finer structure than might normally be associated with Durif.

We employ different techniques in both the vineyard and winery to create this disctinction between our Durif and Petite Sirah releases.

Vintage Conditions

2014 was an excellent vintage throughout North-East Victoria with good spring rains, and mild, settled conditions through the ripening period. The resulting wines show a fine balance of structure and fruit concentration.

Grape Variety

Petite Sirah (Durif)

Maturation

15 months in new, one and two year old French oak

Colour

Totally opaque with purple-maroon highlights

Nose

Full and floral; violet, lavender and sweet spice with darker notes of earth and graphite.

Palate

Strikes a perfect balance between richness and restraint. Attractive blueberry, blackberry and cinnamon spice, with fine tannins and varietal earthy notes developing though the mid-palate. Hard to resist now, though possesses an ideal structure for long term cellaring.
